

Message from Mr Hiley

Last week school had to reintroduce a number of restrictive measures in order to deal with an outbreak of Covid. Thankfully, this week the situation appears to have improved, with no further confirmed cases being reported, meaning that on Tuesday of this week school was able to return to more 'usual' routines and activities. As per my e-mail to parents/carers this means the following :

- Class bubbles will no longer be needed and the playground and communal spaces can be shared once again.
- Children will not be separated in Breakfast or After School Clubs.
- Tuesday Sports Club with Coach Gunn will be open to all regular participants
- Hall based assemblies will resume
- In line with the latest DfE advice, there will no longer be a requirement to wear a face-mask in classrooms OR in communal areas such as corridors for staff or visitors. You may wish to continue to use a face-mask, especially if you are meeting with someone in an enclosed space or office within school.
- Children should continue to be tested using an LFD kit twice weekly to prevent further outbreaks of Covid within school as long as Covid cases remain high in the local community.

As I am sure readers will agree, our Forest School Provision is enthusiastically received by all our children (and parents); what can be better than getting outside and engaging in some outdoor learning and craft activities, whether it be splashing in puddles, creating mud pies, identifying insects, growing veg, foraging or sitting around a campfire our Forest School delivers endless opportunities for children and staff alike. Whilst on the subject of school lunches, Children at school are still looking for an enthusiastic, friendly and approachable person to join the MSA Team. Again, in relation to School Dinners, can I once again remind parents that children CANNOT swap and change between having a packed lunch and/or a school meal. This INCLUDES alternating weekly. It is school policy, which has been agreed by Governors, that children either commit to having a packed lunch, or school meal on a half termly basis. Swapping and changing does have an impact on staffing, ordering and budgets. As a school we do offer three meal options per day and also accommodate special dietary requests. As has always been the case, there are exceptions when a child who usually brings a packed lunch will need to order a meal in an emergency situation, and this can be accommodated. Likewise, if your child would like to try a school meal, or take a meal once per week, then they are welcome to join in with Fun Day Friday which is available EVERY Friday at school or, equally, join in with any of the school's Celebration Meals.
