Finally, I would like to make an attempt to, hopefully, make procedures clearer about reporting a child's illness! If your child is poorly then please contact the school, ideally before 9.00am on 015242 61412. If a member of staff does not pick up the phone, please leave a message.

If your child is showing any symptoms of Covid19 then we would recommend that you contact your GP and/or follow the below guidance :

As I am sure you will appreciate, staff at the school are not medically trained and are unable to give advice on children's illnesses and whether or not they are potentially infected with COVID19. If you do suspect your child has Covid, and you are advised or decide that your child needs to be tested, then you must contact the school immediately and notify them of this action. Please remember it is better to be safe than sorry. I cannot impress enough on everyone how important it is to isolate and follow guidance. It is imperative to help prevent the potential spread of this awful virus that we all work together to stem any potential cross-infection as quickly as possible should there be a case in our school community.

Whilst, as a school, we cannot enforce parents/carers to provide copies of any tests results, I would ask parents to consider sharing any results, if only to provide reassurance to members of staff etc.

Finally, as a reminder, if your child picks up a tummy bug, this includes sickness, diarrhoea or both ailments at the same time, then you must keep them at home

for 48 hours following the final episode of vomiting or diarrhoea. This applies in all cases – there are no exceptions to the rule.

**Protecting your Child against Influenza (Flu) and Complications** This year, ALL children in Reception, Years 1,2,3,4,5 and 6 will be given an opportunity to receive a FREE nasal influenza vaccination at the school on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2020. In order for your child to receive this vaccination, consent needs to be given by parents/carers, as follows:
