Dear Parents/Carers

What a lovely week we have had with glorious sunshine. Children in all classes have enjoyed getting outside and have taken part in cross country at Ingleton, PE on the field, exploring in the wildlife garden and even taking part in a Viking raid... ask the children about this one - rumour has it that Mr Lockett really got into the acting and role play!

On Tuesday, Mrs Cadman assisted by other members of staff accompanied the whole of Key Stage 2 to Ingleton so children could take part in a Cross Country competition. ALL of our children represented our school incredibly well and we are all very proud of their behaviour and attitude at this event. Well done boys and girls!

All of our Nursery children are now settled into school life and it is great to have some new families joining our school. Please do keep spreading the good news about our wonderful school and encouraging new families in the area to join us.

This week teachers used our weekly staff meeting to discuss our whole curriculum and considering what skills and knowledge we would like our children to learn as they progress through school. We know that we already offer a very broad and balanced curriculum but we are keen to continually review this to make sure we are meeting the needs of all our children in the modern world. Our parents e-mail inbox has been filling up with photographs of children from Class 2 this week as they complete their brainbuilder homework! Keep sending pictures in as it is great to see children learning at home.

Can I also please provide a gentle reminder and a plea for parents/carers to show consideration and consider safety implications when both dropping children off and collecting them from school. As I am sure everyone will be more than aware, the school car park gets very chaotic at certain peak times during the day! Recently, it has been reported to me on numerous occasions that vehicles are parking on pathways, blocking road entrances and, in some cases, blocking the gateway to the school. Whilst it is appreciated that parking is limited, can parents/carers please

ensure that they park sensibly and ensure that they are not blocking the carriageway, parking illegally, or blocking a clear view of the road. I am also aware of some drivers not obeying the school crossing patrol officer and driving around children as they cross the road! I will be contacting the Police today to make them aware of this issue and asking for their assistance with this.

As a reminder, there is a meeting for parents of children in years 2 and 3 at 6.00pm on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> September about this year's residential to Halton Gill. This will be an informal meeting, and an opportunity for parents to raise any questions they may have. If you haven't paid the deposit for your child, please do so by Monday 23<sup>rd</sup>. On Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> September at 3.30pm there will be a 'Welcome to Class 1 and 2' event for parents of children in these classes. It would be lovely to see as many parents as possible popping into their child's classroom and having a look around. The meeting will be for 15-20 minutes maximum.

Children will leave school at 1.45pm to walk to church. **Parent helpers are welcome and very much needed.** Please speak to your child's class teacher! Parents can also join us at church for a 2.30pm start. **Please can ALL parents collect children at 3.30pm from church.** The car park and field opposite will be open to assist with parking and the school bus will collect children from the church instead of from school. Please send your child with a food donation to contribute during the service. Please do join us in church, there is lots of space and it would be great to see lots of people there. Nursery children will remain in school with Mrs Chapman and Mrs Johnson.

On the morning of Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> September children in Year 5 and Year 6 have been invited to Settle College to an Open Day Event. Children will be collected from school by mini-bus and returned to school in time for lunch!
