**Breakfast Club** Can we remind parents/carers that our wonderful Breakfast Club is once again fully operational! Children can be dropped off at the School Hall from 8.00am onwards. Full sessions,

including activities, breakfast and refreshments run from 8.00am until 9.00am and are priced at £4.00 per child per day. Half sessions are also available, priced at £2.00 per child per day including activities and refreshments. #### **Drop off and Collection of Children at School**

Can we please remind parents/carers NOT to let children play with any of the school's playtime equipment, including balls, rackets, climbing frames, and fixed structures on both the playground and field at the start and the end of the school day. Equipment has been designated to specific classes within the school, and if children touch the equipment without it being cleaned and/or quarantined this does not support the prevention of any potential Covid outbreak. Whilst it seems very alien not to encourage children to engage in play, I am sure parents/carers will agree it is very important we all follow the rules and help to prevent the potential spread of Covid. Thank you.

**Trick or Treat Warning** We have been advised by Police that they have received multiple reports of children being 'intoxicated' by Cannabis Sweets. These sweets are both dangerous and illegal. Whilst a number of packets of sweets have been seized by the Police, there are still some in circulation. Sweets are wrapped in packets that are designed to look like real children's sweets, but unfortunately the content has a high THC level. There have been reports in the press that sweets are being marketed in packages that look very similar to well-known sweet brands, e.g. Haribo. Amongst the 'illegal' edibles are sweets such as Gummie Bears, Cherry Candy, Watermelon Rings, Stoney Patch, Nerds Rope Bites and Peach Rings. #### **Free School Meals Eligibility**

As personal circumstances continue to change, some families are, unfortunately, finding it harder and harder to make ends meet. It may be that if income has recently reduced your child/ren may now be eligible for a Free School Meal (FSM). For those children in Reception, years 1 and 2 FSM eligibility is in addition to the Universal Free School Meal provided on a daily basis. ### **URGENT (Parents of children in Nursery) Applying for a place in Reception at Bentham C P School**

If you are the parent of a Nursery child born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2016 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2017 then you MUST apply for a Primary School Place for your child to start Reception in September 2021. You must apply for a school place even if your Nursery aged child has an older sibling that attends the school, or if your child currently attends the Nursery provision.
