**After School Clubs : Can you help?** As a school we are continually striving to improve our 'service' to parents, carers and children. Recently, a number of after-school club activities have been offered to children, whilst some of the provision provided has been free of charge, there has been a cost involved in others, with the school heavily subsidising the cost per child for parents. After School Clubs have included Film Club, Basketball, Jammie Dodgers, Spanish Club and Judo. We are dedicated to enhancing a child's overall learning experience at school and are keen to promote after school club activities. However, historically there has been a very poor up-take in attendance at some clubs, meaning that they have been cancelled. As a parent, we are interested to find out how you feel about after school clubs?
