Talking PANTS. By asking parents/carers to talk PANTS is giving an opportunity to help keep children safe from sexual abuse, without using scary adult words. Guides are also available for parents/carers of children with learning difficulties, including disabilities. There is even information about how to talk PANTS for deaf children. The NSPCC have a range of services available, which include support for vulnerable mums and dads including therapy and protection and opportunities to work alongside other professionals. Share Aware is an online safety campaign. It is a great resource aiming to help parents/carers keep their children safe on social networks, apps and games.
